

Corona Virus Frequently Asked Questions - PPE for paid Personal Assistants and unpaid family carers

The Integrated Commissioning Service will continue to issue updates to PA's and Carer's and this Frequently Asked Questions document will updated and re-circulated to reflect any changes in guidance. For ease of reference any changes will be highlighted.

1) What PPE should paid personal assistants wear?	The government has issued guidance on the PPE that should be worn within social care settings: https://www.buckinghamshire.gov.uk/coronavirus/social-care-providers-hub/infection-prevention-control-testing/personal-and-protective-equipment/
	If you are a paid PA who delivers care to people in other households to your own then you should follow the guidance for domiciliary care settings.
	If you only deliver care to someone within your own household then you should follow the guidance for family carers: https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/coronavirus-covid-19-providing-unpaid-care/guidance-for-those-who-provide-unpaid-care-to-friends-or-family

3) I need to order PPE for the PA I employ / I am a self-employed PA and need to order my own PPE. My usual order has been delayed, what should I do?

We would recommend that you continue to try and obtain PPE through your usual supply routes. However, if there is significant delay or the supplier is unable to fulfil the order at all, then you may wish to consider trying an alternative supplier see list below: (please note that this is not a recommendation of these suppliers).

9) Both myself and my family members need to access public transport. Will you provide PPE for me to do this safely?	From 15 June 2020, it is the law that you must wear a face covering when travelling in England on a: • bus or coach • train or tram • ferry or hovercraft or other vessel • aircraft • cable car
	If you do not wear a face covering you will be breaking the law and could be fined £100 (or £50 if you pay the fine within 14 days).
	A face covering is a covering of any type which covers your nose and mouth and can be made at home (including a scarf, bandana or snood). Surgical masks or respirators used by healthcare and other workers as part of personal protective equipment (PPE) are not required. We would not therefore anticipate that individuals will not need to purchase face masks or other forms of PPE in order to use public transport. Therefore you will not require a direct payment to cover additional PPE for this purpose.
	Some people don't have to wear a face covering including for health, age or equality reasons. Some transport staff may not wear a face covering if it is not required for their job.
	You should also wear a face covering in other enclosed spaces where it is difficult to maintain social distancing. For example, at stations, interchanges, ports and airports and in taxis and private hire vehicles. A taxi driver or private

	hire vehicle operator may be entitled to refuse to accept you if you do not wear a face covering. The rule applies in situations where individuals from different households could be travelling together on a service such as a charter boat, but not if you are giving a lift to someone from another household in your private car. Face coverings are not a substitute for maintaining social distancing and good hand hygiene.
10) I have cancelled my carers due to concerns over Covid 19 and now require PPE for my family members to support with my personal care?	If this applies to you then please speak to your social worker. We will discuss whether it would be appropriate to provide a one off direct payment for 3 months. This would provide you with additional funds to purchase PPE until the usual care arrangements can be resumed. Please note that family members who live with the cared for person are only required to wear PPE, such as aprons or gloves, that would normally require to undertake personal care tasks. No additional PPE for COVID-19 is required in this situation unless you receive specific medical advice to do so.
