Recipe



'Mini Christmas Puddings' double chocolate chip cupcakes



INGREDIENTS

- 115g self-raising flour
- 115g softened butter
- 115g caster sugar
- · 2 eggs beaten
- 30g cocoa powder
- · 100g milk chocolate chips
- 80g icing sugar (plus extra for dusting)
- holly berry sprinkles (or red & green sprinkles)

INSTRUCTIONS

- Preheat oven to 190°C. Place 12 cupcake cases in a muffin tray.
- Sift flour into a bowl. Add butter, caster sugar, cocoa powder and eggs. Beat mixture until smooth. Add chocolate chips into the mixture and stir to combine.
- Bake in pre-heated oven for 15–20 minutes (or until well risen and cooked through). When cooked, transfer to wire rack to cool.
- To make the icing, sift icing sugar into a bowl and stir enough warm water to make a thick icing. Spoon icing onto each cupcake. Before the icing sets, place the holly berry sprinkles on top of the icing. Once the icing has set, sift a little icing sugar over the cupcakes.
